Purpose



- > data/technology projects








NUTRITION PROMOTION

- > nutritious food incentives








CAPACITY -BUILDING GRANTS

- > development of accessible tools and processes


Grant Amounts: \$100,000 - \$250,000





CAPACITY -BUILDING GRANTS






FOOD DISTRIBUTION GRANTS

- > infant formula
- > personal hygiene products such as diapers
- > staffing and other direct expenses associated with the procurement of items.

Who can apply?

Those eligible to apply include:

- Community-based organizations (CBOs)
- Fiscally-sponsored organizations
- Faith-based organizations
- Small businesses
- Social enterprises
- Local government agencies
- School districts

Those NOT eligible to apply include:

- Individuals
- State government





#1: Your Project Location

• Project MUST primarily operate in areas identified as "highest" and "high" needs categories by the LA County Equity Explorer.

#2: Financial Hardships

• Applicants who faced financial insecurity during the COVID-19 pandemic are also eligible.







How to use the Equity Explorer Tool?


STEP 1: CLICK THE LINK TO ACCESS THE LA COUNTY EQUITY EXPLORER TOOL.

STEP 2: CLICK THE MAGNIFYING GLASS ICON TO SEARCH FOR AN ADDRESS.






How do I use the Equity Explorer Tool?






